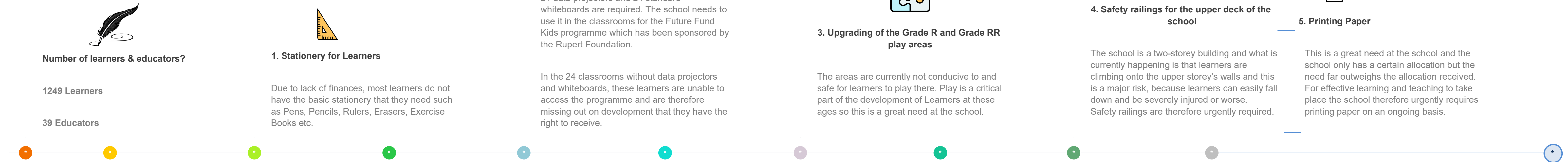





## DR GJ Joubert Primary School Current Needs

**1. Stationery for Learners**

Due to lack of finances, most learners do not have the basic stationery that they need such as Pens, Pencils, Rulers, Erasers, Exercise Books etc.


  
**2. Projectors and White boards**

24 data projectors and 24 standard whiteboards are required. The school needs to use it in the classrooms for the Future Fund Kids programme which has been sponsored by the Rupert Foundation.

In the 24 classrooms without data projectors and whiteboards, these learners are unable to access the programme and are therefore missing out on development that they have the right to receive.

  
**3. Upgrading of the Grade R and Grade RR play areas**

The areas are currently not conducive to and safe for learners to play there. Play is a critical part of the development of Learners at these ages so this is a great need at the school.

  
**4. Safety railings for the upper deck of the school**

The school is a two-storey building and what is currently happening is that learners are climbing onto the upper storey's walls and this is a major risk, because learners can easily fall down and be severely injured or worse. Safety railings are therefore urgently required.

  
**5. Printing Paper**

This is a great need at the school and the school only has a certain allocation but the need far outweighs the allocation received. For effective learning and teaching to take place the school therefore urgently requires printing paper on an ongoing basis.

  
**6. Life Skills Training for Learners, Parents and Educators**

Learners, Parents and Educators on a day-to-day basis face many challenges. By providing them with Life Skills they would not only be able to overcome these challenges but thrive despite them. They would also be able to individually and collectively work towards putting systems in place that would improve their current and future circumstances.

  
**7. Sports Clothes and Equipment**

*Rugby Netball – the school's team is the Helderberg Champs for under 11 & 13 and they will require sponsorships to compete against the teams of other areas in order for them to receive Western Cape Colours.*

The school is trying their best to offer the above-mentioned extra-mural activities to their learners. However, due to a lack of funding the school does not have the required equipment to effectively train the learners in the sports codes. Due to the lack of finances, their learners are also unable to afford the uniforms and gear that these sports codes require.

  
**8. Sponsorship needed for Drum Majorettes to go to Polokwane**

The school's Drum Majorettes are currently the Boland Drum Majorettes Champions and the school requires R 150 000 to send them to Polokwane to compete at National Level.

  
**9. Secure Fences around the School**

In order to protect the school buildings and property, as well as the learners, educators and visitors, the school urgently requires secure fencing right around the school.

  
**10. Sponsorship for Security for Night Duty**

There is currently no security at the school at night. This leaves the school vulnerable to vandalism and theft. The school therefore urgently requires sponsorship in order for them to appoint a Security Guard at night.

  
**11. Upgrading of grounds around the Hall**

The school uses their hall quite often, but the grounds around the school is not paved which results in a risk for those who enters the hall. The school therefore requires an upgrading and paving of the grounds around the hall.

  
**12. Teacher Development – integrating ICT into subject teaching**

Support for Educators is required in terms of the technical aspects in relation to the academic programmes. There is also a great need to have ICT integrated into the subjects that are being offered to learners so that it can be engaging and interesting to learners.

**There is a company called Optimi that could assist with this, as well as adding value to the technical side of Maths teaching, but the costing is as follows, which the school would desperately want, but cannot afford:**

- Professional Development Course for Educators – 21st Century Educator: R6825 per School, which includes training that focuses on the main competencies that educators require to be effective 21-century teachers. It is made up of 10 modules, including Implementing e-Learning and Blended Learning.
- Learning Hacks - Brain-Based Study Methods for Learning: R500 per person and includes two sessions of two hours each
- CAMI Education Software – both online and offline versions available which will improve literacy and numeracy. They provide the CAMI Edusuite offline programme for computer labs for Primary Schools and High Schools. It includes reading, mathematics, perceptual learning, science and literacy. The cost is R15225 for all five learning areas or R 10185 per learning area.
